

COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS (CHCs) are non-profit or public comprehensive primary care providers with a mission to provide health care to low income working families.

Community Health Centers are the health care home for thousands of working families across Colorado.

- 15 CHCs operate 138 clinic sites in 35 Colorado counties and provided 1.7 million visits to more than 419,000 patients in 2008.
- 13 CHCs operate 37 dental clinic sites in 21 Colorado counties and provided 175,000 visits to more than 76,000 patients in 2008.
- 90% of patients served by CHCs have family incomes below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (\$42,400 per year for a family of four in 2008).

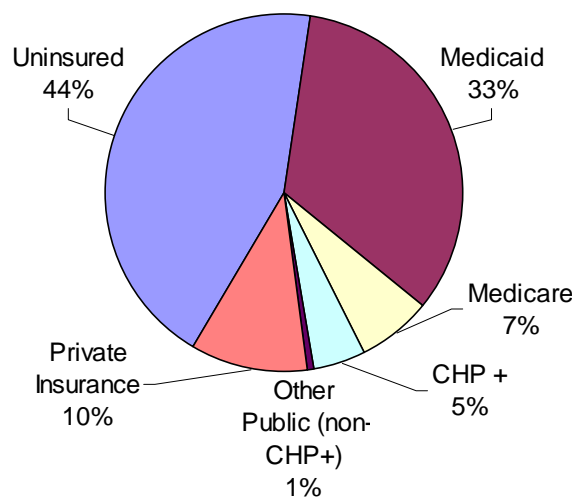
Community Health Centers are a sound investment in Colorado communities.
