Community Health Center Staff Honored Safety Net Health Care Improvements Celebrated

DENVER— Community Health Center staff members were honored last night at the annual quality improvement awards ceremony of the Colorado Community Health Network (CCHN). In addition, scholarships were awarded to Colorado Health Center entry-level staff members who are in training to advance their health care careers while continuing to care for patients.

CCHN's annual clinical quality awards honor outstanding Community Health Center (CHC) staff members and partner safety-net providers who participate in CCHN's health care quality improvement efforts. Children's Oral Health Outcomes Partnership (COHOP)

COHOP increases collaboration between dental and medical providers to improve oral health outcomes for Colorado's children. This project aims to prevent childhood oral disease through a data driven, quality improvement program based in the medical setting. The 15 clinics participating in COHOP have formed quality improvement teams that include both medical and dental staff. Teams meet regularly with the goal of making continuous improvements in the quality of oral disease prevention services they offer to patients.

Colorado Oral Health Network (COHN) Data for Clinical Quality Project

COHN is comprised of CHCs with dental clinics and other non-profit dental clinics from across the state. COHN's mission is to increase access to high quality oral health care for underserved Coloradans. COHN's Data for Clinical Quality Project was created to develop a system to measure, analyze, and share oral health outcomes. This helps improve the oral health of the patients served by COHN members. The project is focused on preventive services, completed treatment plans, the number of young children accessing dental care, and availability for emergency cases.

Healthy Woman Outreach Project

The Healthy Woman Outreach Project improves the health of participating CHC patients by increasing their awareness of and access to breast and cervical cancer screenings and appropriate follow-up services. Since 1999, participating CHC have provided approximately 8,000 clinical breast exams, mammograms, diagnostics, or case management services to over 4,000 patients. CHC staff members were nominated by their CHCs for providing breast and cervical health services to individuals who would otherwise not have access to these life saving services.
